

# Who we are & what we do.

Forget-Me-Notts is Operation Orphan's UK based project. We meet the practical needs of the most vulnerable children in our local community and help each child to know they are not forgotten.

# What we do

Through our referral process we give targeted, practical help to 'at risk' children across the East Midlands and the Fylde Coast in Lancashire, in many cases helping to prevent children from being taken into care. Often, cases are closed to social care after the families have received our support.

## How it works

Support agencies such as Social Services assess each child's needs and submit a referral to us with an overview of the family's situation and a list of items that would significantly improve the quality and safety of the child's environment. This often includes items such as beds and safety gates, which are basic necessities in any home but are not so easily obtainable for families dealing with unemployment, homelessness or escaping domestic violence.

# An immediate impact

We like to share photos of our completed referrals on our social media pages to show that items donated to us have been given directly to families that need them. This can really inspire people as they are able to see the difference their donation has helped to make. Although we can't ever show pictures of the children we are providing for, the feedback we receive always confirms that this is having a huge impact and empowering social workers to make a significant difference.

# FAQS

#### Do donations have to be brand new?

No, we can accept donations of pre-loved items as long as they are in a good condition with no damage, stains or missing parts.

# Can you guarantee that my donation will go to a referral family?

The vast majority of items donated are used to fulfil our referrals, but occasionally this is not possible. If we receive donations of items that we cannot use, we reserve the right to either pass them on to another charity, recycle or sell them to benefit our projects.

#### Are there any items that you cannot take?

Yes. We cannot take donations of second-hand white goods, electrical items, or mattresses for cots/cot beds.

## Do you collect donations?

Yes. We are a very small team but as long as you live within a 10-mile radius from our office in Attenborough, we can plan to collect at a time that fits in with us delivering referrals. Smaller donations can be dropped off at our office at an agreed time.
